

PSYCHIATRIC REHABILITATION SERVICES

Aurora's Psychiatric Rehabilitation program assists individuals with psychiatric disabilities to increase their success and satisfaction in the roles and environments of their choice. Using a strength-based approach, participants are invited to explore the roles that are important to them in the **living, learning, working, and socializing** environments.

The ultimate goal is **RECOVERY**. This includes regaining the roles that may have been lost as a result of illness, as well as pursuing new roles. Aurora believes that all individuals have the ability to learn **and grow**.

Psychiatric rehabilitation is based on each individual's needs and choices. **Individuals have the right to direct their own affairs related to their psychiatric disability and the services they receive.** This service is person-centered, meaning that each participant is viewed as an individual rather than as a diagnosis.

Aurora Services uses S.M.A.R.T. goals. This means that rehabilitation goals will be specific, measurable, attainable, realistic, and time-bound. The focus is on what the individual wants.

The staff at Aurora Services are Certified Psychiatric Rehabilitation Practitioners, recognized by the international Psychiatric Rehabilitation Association.

Get the job done! Learn and practice job searching skills, people skills, résumé and letter writing techniques, interviewing tips, professional etiquette, and much more.

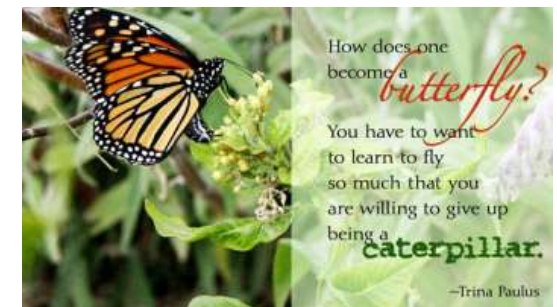
INTERPERSONAL RELATIONSHIPS

In order to attend psychiatric rehabilitation, an individual must:

- Be at least 18 years old
- Have a qualifying diagnosis of a serious mental illness
- Have a functional impairment that interferes with role performance in the living, working, education, and/or social domains
- Choose to attend

Aurora's psychiatric rehabilitation offers **site-based** services. **Mobile services** may be provided for those who are unable to attend on-site. Transportation assistance may be available via DART. Referral to this program requires a recommendation from a Licensed Practitioner of the Healing Arts.

Located within Beaver, Aurora Services provides a welcoming atmosphere for those who are interested in mental health recovery.
