Transition Program**

Prepare for life after high school with the School to Work transition program.

The **School to Work** transition program is available to students ages of 14 – 21 who have an IEP and focuses on employment, post- secondary education, training opportunities and community living.

You will have a chance to learn about yourself, your community and how to prepare for the future. Small group and individual activities allow you to explore your interests, identify your strengths and learn about your preferences.

The program offers instructional work classes; vocational assessments; community tours; volunteer opportunities; and paid work experiences to help you decide what you want to do after graduation. If you are interested in securing employment after you complete the program, job placement is also available.

Classes in the program cover a wide range of topics to help you achieve success at home, in your community and at work.

- Social skills
- Communication and team building
- Travel training
- Driver's education
- Money management
- Independent living
- Community exploration
- Post-secondary education options
- Community supports
- Personal safety
